



Workshop from Home with Kirsty Kash Resources for June 14, 2023

- Kirsty Kash's studio is about 200 sq ft.
- She uses a cone 5–6 porcelain clay body from Plainsman Clays called Polar Ice.
- Kirsty bisque fires to cone 04 and glaze fires to cone 6.
- She uses a variety of Amaco Velvet Underglazes to decorate her work. <u>Amaco Field</u> <u>Guide</u>
- All of her current work is wheel thrown.
- Her tabletop is <u>Hardie Backer Cement Board</u> (She is currently using ½ inch).
- Kirsty's favorite tools include:
 - DiamondCore[®] Tools <u>P1 curved V Tip Carving Tool</u> (and the replacement blades because she goes through them often)
 - Alternate is the <u>Kemper WLS Double Loop tool</u>
 - DiamondCore® Tools <u>L1 Diamond Sgraffito Stylus Tool</u>
 - Damp box to keep her pots leather hard for longer
 - o Fine point Sharpie[™] Permanent Marker, specifically the Milwaukee Inkzall
 - Grout sponge for wiping away excess underglazes
 - Dirty Girls Bat System with inserts: <u>Round</u> and <u>Square</u>
 - Mud tools Ribs, specifically the <u>blue rib</u> and various <u>stainless steel ribs</u>
 - o <u>Dolan 120</u>
 - Tip: <u>Ball Bearings</u> to help with mixing the underglazes, she has been using a 4mm, but recommends sizing up.
 - Laguna Liquid <u>Water Based Latex</u>
- Tools needed if you'd like to work along at home:
 - Leather-hard piece
 - Wax resist: She uses <u>Wax Emulsion "R"</u> from Plainsman Clays on her pieces.
 - Studio Sharpie[™] (that you're okay with ruining)
 - Underglaze
 - o Brushes <u>#10 Round Synthetic Brush</u>
 - Sponge
