

Workshop from Home with Justin Rothshank Resources for January 13, 2026

- Justin's studio includes a 600 sq-ft (182.8 sq-m) workspace, 600 sq-ft (182.8 sq-m) showroom, and an outdoor kiln shed with workspaces.
- When Justin works with earthenware in the soda kiln, he uses Standard Clay Company's [#308 Brooklyn Red](#), or a hybrid reclaim clay that is a mash-up of [#308](#), [#417](#), [#103](#), and random grogs. When Justin wood fires, he uses a variety of clays from [Starworks](#) in North Carolina or from [Standard Clay Company](#).
- Justin bisque fires to cone 04 or cone 08.
- When using an electric kiln, he glaze fires to cone 06. In the soda kiln, Justin fires to cone 3 or cone 10. In the wood kiln, he glaze fires to cone 10–11.
- Justin uses a variety of building techniques, including wheel throwing, coil building, and slab building.
- Some of his favorite tools include: [Mudtools ribs](#), a handmade knife from his son, [Amaco brushes and sponges](#), and [brushes from Troy Bungart](#).
- Justin uses a porcelain slip (recipe listed below), as well as [liquid underglazes](#) and [underglaze chalk](#) from Amaco, and underglaze chalk from [Stone's Handmade](#).
- His favorite glazes for cone 3 are Darby Clear or Darby White (both recipes listed below).

- Justin has had many studio assistants in the past but is currently between assistants. He regularly works with a community of makers and friends to fire his kilns and who help him out when needed.
