- Amy Irish's studio is 12x24-sq ft (3.7x7.3-sq m).
- She uses Highwater Clays' Earthen Red clay.
- Amy wheel throws her pieces, and bisque fires to cone 06, and glaze fires to cone 2.
- Her favorite underglazes are <u>Amaco Velvet Underglazes</u> and <u>Mayco Fundamentals</u>
 <u>Underglazes</u>. She also uses Oestreich White Slip and Darby Clear and Darby Liner glazes
 on her pots. Those recipes are listed below.
 - Amaco Velvet Real Orange
 - Amaco Velvet Intense Yellow
 - o Amaco Velvet Blue Green
 - Amaco Velvet Electric Blue
 - Amaco Velvet Radiant Red
- Porcelain used is Highwater Porcelain P5
