Many members were unable to attend the Potters Council General Meeting at **NCECA** in Philadelphia, so I would like to give you an overview.

- **MENTORING.** This is one area where we always end up with more hard questions than easy answers.
- **BUSINESS & COMMUNITY OUTREACH.** These are new categories and wide open for ideas.
- **10th BIRTHDAY.** Yes, this was the fun table where we all got to submit our wish list for a grand celebration! We will be ten years old next year and I definitely voted for balloons and cake!!

What is my bottom line on meeting with Members both new and renewed? I am more confident than ever that Potters Council is on the right track. The Board is full of energy and purpose. We are getting our to-do lists done. Paul Wandless' new Membership Committee has been very active and effective. They're always open to more volunteers and I guarantee your voice will be heard.

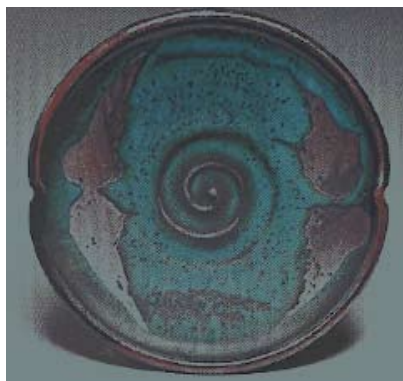
